clubs, and we are pleased that the hard work of everyone at our school has been rewarded.


Well done to Mrs Jones, our PE Lead, for driving this initiative too.

beyond to be kind and helpful. I know Zac will do so well at high school! I am so proud of him!




Random Acts of Kindness

Aspirations' Week

We are holding a whole school Aspirations' Week next week. The children are being visited by a range of different careers from BBC Broadcasters, coders, fire brigade, scientists, and engineers.

Two classes are visiting the new MANzone facility at Manchester airport. The whole school will take place in a role play afternoon where they get the chance to try out being a hairdresser, chef, spy, scientist, fashion designer, journalist and many more. We are attempting to address gender and race bias and many of our visitors have neurodiversities or struggled at school (including a BBC journalist and podcaster) so all our children feel included and excited about their futures!

A whole school apprentice scheme was advertised this week and children had the chance to apply to be an apprentice Headteacher, school business manager, TA or site manager. Mrs Boardman held interviews with her applicants and they will be doing a range of jobs from attending Computing meetings with her, supporting children, doing assembly and conducting new parent tours. It is going to be very exciting!

We hope by the end of the week, we will have inspired the children.

So on Friday 14th June, we are asking the children to dress up as someone they want to be.

The idea is that we will hold this week biannually so by the time the children leave us in Year 6, they will have been exposed to a wide variety of jobs and careers!








