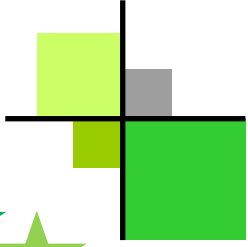


Picking up Children at the End of the Day

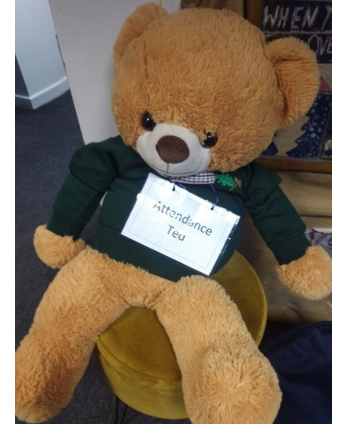

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Aspirations' Week

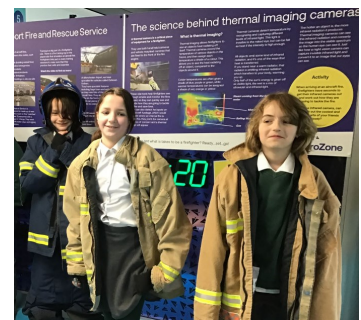
What a truly inspiring week! The children have been visited by a range of different careers from BBC Broadcasters, coders, fire brigade, scientists and engineers.

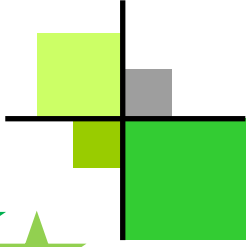
Our whole school apprentice scheme was also successful with children signing up to be the Headteacher, office staff and caretaker!

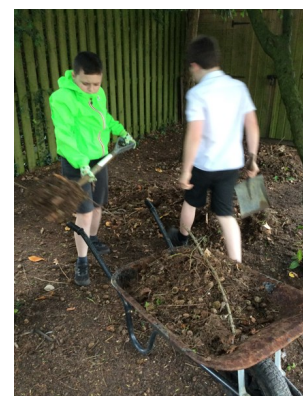
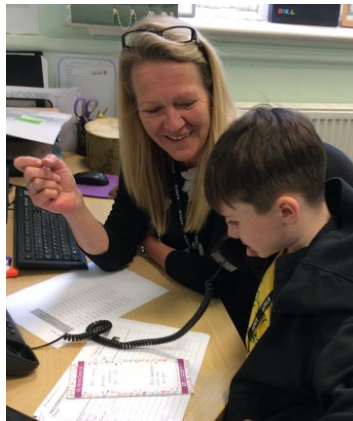

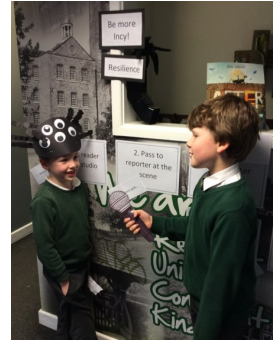




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Our Role Play Carousel

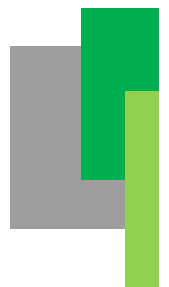
