




#### **Great Work**


#### Random Acts of Kindness

Please send children into school wearing their PE kits. Coloured bands to show house teams will be distributed to the children during the day.


This is a run down of the afternoon's events...

#### Year 3 / 4 Victorian Day at Quarry Bank Mill


This week Year 3 and 4 were lucky enough to be invited to participate in a Victorian workshop at Quarry Bank Mill, linked to their current History topic. Our children explored the various jobs that children of the Victorian era were expected to have, from working in the coal mines to spending twelve hours a day in the factories and mills. They had a tour of the mill, hearing the stories of young children just like them and compared how different life was. They manipulated coins from the past, and worked collaboratively to 'purchase' items using these coins. Mrs Yardley-Goldrick was particularly proud to see that the children were bridging back to their classroom knowledge when talking to staff at the Mill. They were also asking brilliant questions, demonstrating their thirst for knowledge which is always wonderful to see!


