


### **Great Work**

Styal Primary School Valuing the Individual to Believe and Achieve

We are a registered charity governed by the Charity Commission, we exist to raise funds for the school and the children within the school by running events and activities throughout the year for the school pupils and their families.

We are all volunteers made up of parents, carers and grandparents from across all year groups - and we are always looking for more help and more ideas. Being part of Parents of Styal (POS) is a great way to get to know other parents/carers across the school and to actively play a part in helping the school and our children. We help to create a sense of community through the social events we create such as the Discos and Fairs - providing fun experiences as well as much needed items for the school.

Since 2018 POS have raised over £25,000 to support the primary school. Money raised has paid for items which could not otherwise be afforded within the school budget such as The Trim Trail, laptops, IT packages, sports equipment, Year 6 graduation hoodies and the leavers' day out, The Book Barn as well as coaches for trips, items for forest school and books.
