### **Games Makers**




Our Games makers do a fantastic job organising games for the younger children at break. They have had some training this week to help plan and run even more exciting activities.

If your child is absent from school, please contact the school office by leaving a message on the answerphone. If we have not heard from you, our policy is to telephone home at 9.30am.


#### Mr Smith's PE Awards

Well done Mia.






Oscar created a masterpiece in Breakfast Club this week.

### **Upcoming Events at Styal**


