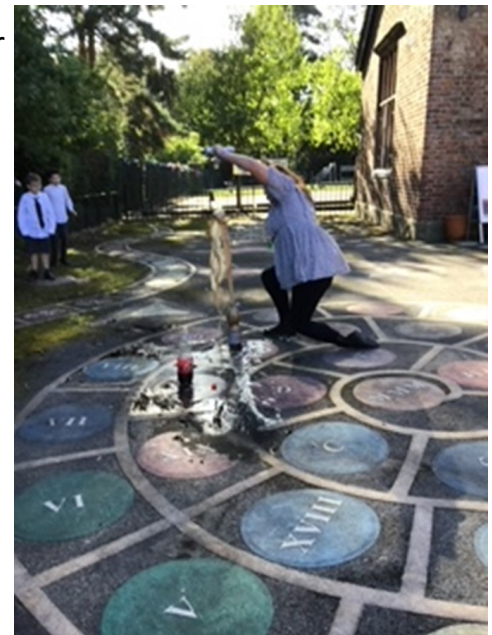

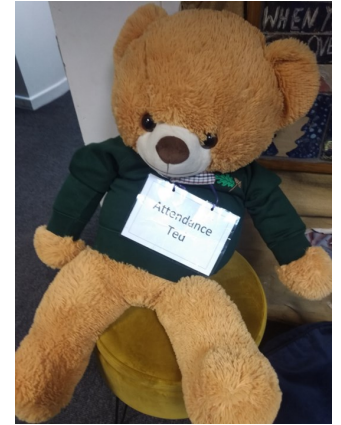

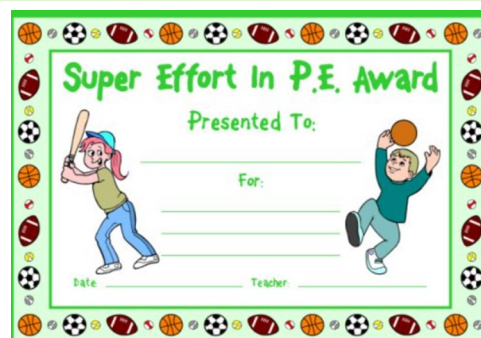
House Points

Mr Smith's PE Awards

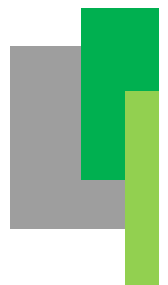
In KS1– Grace awarded the certificate for the effort she made and improving her technique. In KS2, Marcus impressed Mr Smith with his teamwork skills at football.

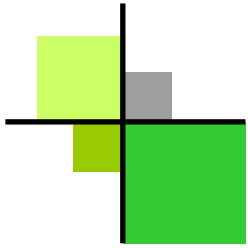

Daisy was so inspired by her science lesson this week, she went home and made her own lemonade. It is great when children take their learning home—well done Daisy for giving it a try at



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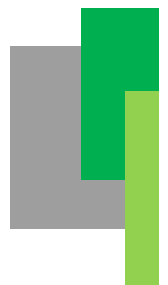


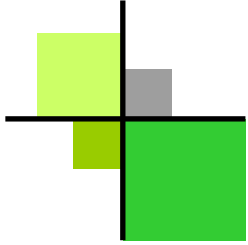
During a Games maker session this week, Lucas helped one of the children get their bib on and off when it became tricky and encouraged the others to participate.

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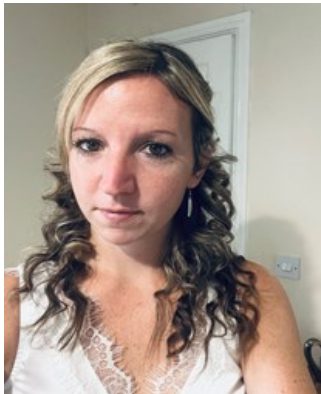
Harvest Festival Assembly
