


We are holding our first **Open Morning** of the year on Thursday 24th October. Parents are invited in to their child's class at 8.45am so children can share the learning they have done so far this term.

Mr Smith's PE Awards





Headteacher's Award




Random Acts of Kindness

Oscar has been highly praised this week by Mrs Hennessey for his persuasive writing and so he should. It was a powerful piece of work.




