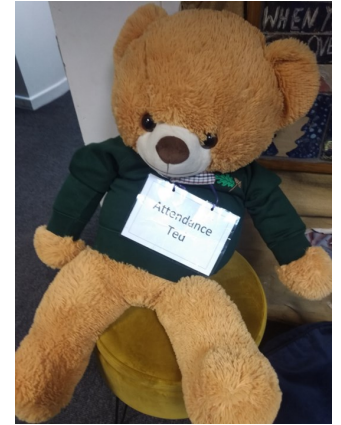

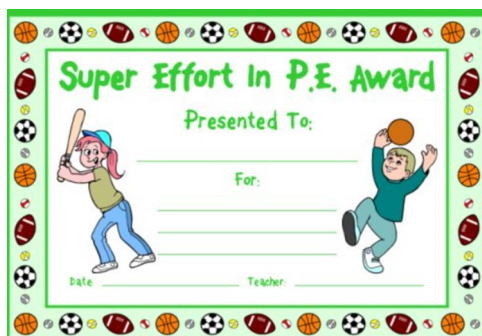
Remembrance Service

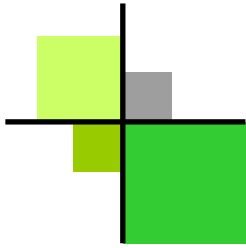
Thank you to everyone who joined the Remembrance Service on Sunday. Our children who did readings at the service, were a credit to the school.



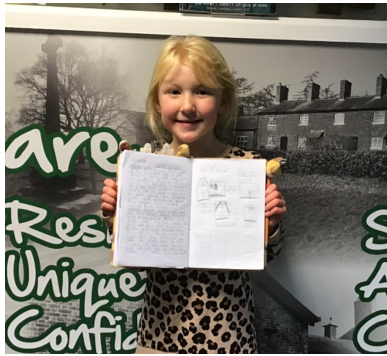
Mr Smith's PE Awards

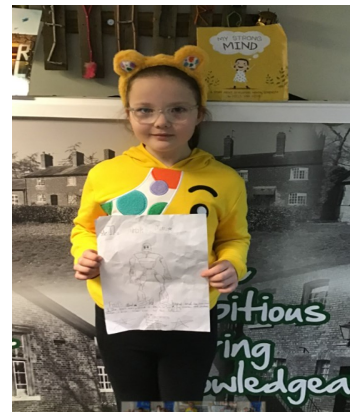


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Great Work!

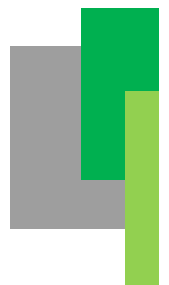


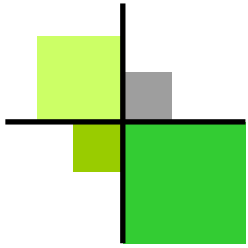
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Fruit tasting in Reception/1

We celebrated Odd Socks Day on Tuesday and each class spent some time in the week to consider how everyone is unique, how we celebrate differences and what makes a good friend.





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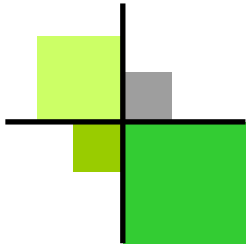
Random Acts of Kindness

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Attendance Matters

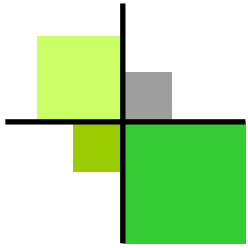
We have sent out a copy of our Attendance Policy this week.

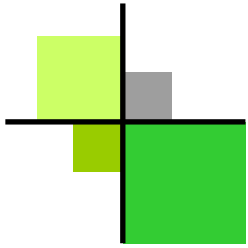
