Please can singers meet at the War Memorial from 4.15pm. Singing is due to start at 4.45pm. However the invitation to join is extended to all children.


Styal Village Association have organised the event which starts at 4pm with a Bauble Hunt and the lights switch on from 5.15pm.

James was celebrated by Mr Smith earlier this week for his work on equivalent fractions. He was determined to reach the challenge of what was a very tricky mathematical concept.






### Delamere

### 5 and 6 Outcomes Morning


