
Mia and Olivia were a credit to the school this week when they met some visitors to talk about their science work. They spoke with confidence and knowledge and I was so very proud of them.

Considerate Driving and Parking

Parking is a topic that is discussed regularly at Styal mostly due to the inconsiderate parking that is reported to us.

Parking and driving safely is a priority for our children.

You must **NOT** park or drop off children at the cross adjacent to Norcliffe Chapel. This causes congestion and can put children at risk when walking to school along the cobbles or entering the green.



You must **NOT** park in front of the residents car park which is clearly marked by a gate. This access **MUST** be kept clear at all times in case of an emergency.

The Cricket Club offer their car park to ease congestion on Altrincham Road. Please park here responsibly and respectfully.

Unless you have been issued a parking permit, please do not park in the staff car park.

If you do need to drive along the cobbles to enter the staff car park, please observe the speed limit.

Quarry Bank Mill offer every family additional free parking in their main car park.
