You may remember a few weeks ago, we shared Daisy's Titanic story on the newsletter.


Daisy then sent her story to Blue Peter and last week she received a Blue Peter Badge in the post!!

Mr Smith's PE Awards



Last Week in Forest School






Forest School Year 3 and 4


Great Work

Freya found an assortment of plastic and wooden cutlery in the hedgerow!


We love finding out about the positive contributions our children make to their

How to earn Blue Peter badges - CBBC






Reception/1 Maths Discovery Walk
