Pixie was thrilled to share her Stage 4 swimming award with me this week. She said she was inspired by the swimming she saw in the Olympics in the summer last.


It is always great to see what the children achieve in clubs outside of school.

Macclesfield Academy. Please photographs on the next page.





Daisy was proud to share the home learning work she had completed last week when we had to close the school unexpectedly.


She had completed work linked to the continents, a variety of different sentence types and some maths work on halving totals.
