This week's certificates went to Marta and Seb who demonstrated a great balancing and jumping routine and were able to share to their class.





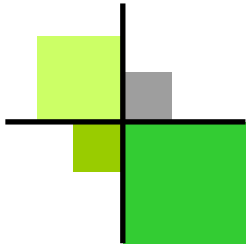

This week they had the chance to create their design using Modroc. As you can see, their designs were very detailed .



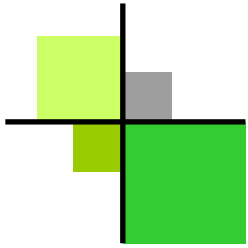

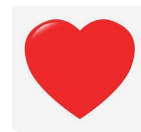




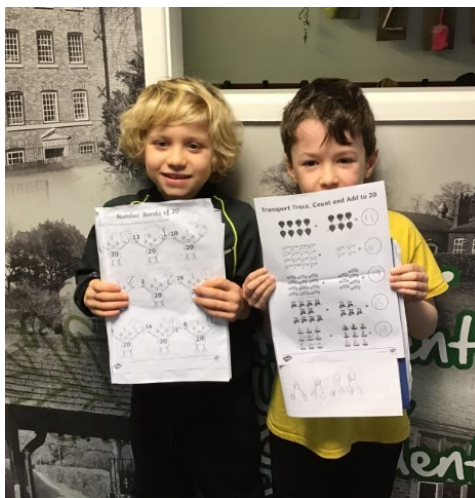

History in Year 1 and 2

Do you know who invented Lego?

This week, the children found out how and why Lego was invented. Ole Kirk Christiansen designed the first Lego brick in Denmark in 1932 from wood.

After a fire in his workshop, he created the first Lego piece from plastic. The children have loved finding out about Lego but more importantly, enjoyed playing with it!



Do you know what Lego means?

It comes from the Danish word *'leg godt'* meaning *'play well'*.
